

Measuring for your new blinds is easier than you might think! All you have to do is follow our simple tips, double-check everything you do, and set aside some time to do it. Below is a handy guide for measuring for Roman blinds.

Standard Windows

Recess Fitting






These handy video guides will walk you through measuring for recess fitting (fitting the blind inside the window recess) and **exact fitting** (fitting the blind onto the wall above the recess).

For a step-by-step written guide and for advice if your windows are a little more unusual (e.g. bay windows, or recesses that are partly tiled), keep scrolling down.

Recess fitting

If you want your blind to fit **inside the window recess**. If you upgraded to Click2Go then you must measure for recess fitting.



Measure the full width and height of the recess [the size of the hole if you like] and we will make the appropriate deductions to ensure a perfect fit.

• Measure in 3 places for both the width and the drop, use the smallest measurement

Top-Tip:


In the case of Click2Go Roman Blinds, if there is a significant difference between the width at the top of the recess and the width at the narrowest point, we would recommend switching to a standard installation rather than Click2Go.

- Don't make any deductions, we'll deduct 10mm from the width to ensure your blind fits perfectly
- Use a metal tape measure, cloth ones can stretch and give you inaccurate measurements




Check that your recess is deep enough to fit the blind into, also bearing in mind any obstructions such as handles.

Exact fitting



If you want your blind to fit outside the window recess.

Roman Blind Depth 45mm



70mm at the top and 50mm each side

obstacles such as radiators

we will make the blind to the size you specify with no deductions

Measure the full width and height of the recess [the size of the hole if you like and add a little extra to the top and to each side,

- The overlap at the bottom of the blind is a matter of personal choice but please take into account
- Top-Tip:

If you are replacing an existing blind with one of the same size, simply measure the blind (including its fittings) and specify

exact fitting, we will make you one the same size.



Fitting inside a part-tiled recess

If you have tiles part-way up your recess (often the case in kitchens and bathrooms) then the space

between them is most likely to be the narrowest point in the recess.



Measure between the tiles to ensure your blind will fit. A recess of this type is not suitable for Click2Go Roman

Blinds.
